As they move through the school, the children will develop their musical creativity through practical and exploratory opportunities to develop as performers, composers and improvisers. From when the children start in Reception they are exposed to different types of songs and music and can explore different instruments during their continuous provision. As the children move to Year 1, their understanding of the way music is structured develops. They begin to learn different types of vocabulary as well as being exposed to different genres and styles of music. They also can play a variety of tuned and untuned instruments. When they reach Year 2, the children develop a greater understanding of different music across different cultures. They learn about music across a range of historical periods including the works of great composers. They are also able to compose their own music using musical notations.
