Year 4 Spring Term 2 Curriculum Map

This plan is intended to give you some insight into what your child is learning at school. We know that children do best at school when they are supported at home. You may wish to use this a prompt for some discussions about your child's learning. In addition to homework set on My Maths, your child should be reading at least three times per week. We know that reading is the single most important skill for academic success. Reading should be recorded in your child's planner. Children should also have a log in for TT Rockstars; daily practice of their times tables will help secure their knowledge and speed. Children are expected to know all their times tables, up to 12 x 12, by the end of year 4.



English

In our reading this half term, we will be reading a variety of texts, covering fiction, non-fiction, and poetry. The texts we have selected provide the opportunity to discuss stories from other cultures and we will spend time learning to summarise texts and develop our understanding of how to use evidence from a text to support ideas and opinions. Furthermore, we will be developing our inference skills and comparing and contrasting authors' use of language and organisational devices.

For our writing this half term, we will begin by writing a narrative based on the brilliant book 'The Lost Thing' written by Shaun Tan. This will be followed by writing a biography about Nikola Tesla. In addition, we will be learning, and applying punctuation: commas, and apostrophes to mark singular and plural possessions. We will also be continuing to develop our editing skills; this will include proof-reading practice as well as redrafting sentences and rethinking word choices to better achieve the desired effect or atmosphere.
